ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

ABOUT CAMP MUSART

Camp MusArt is LAMusArt's five-week Musical Theatre focused enrichment program for students ages 7 to 16 that work together that combines music, visual arts, dance and drama disciplines to produce a full-length musical performance in a professional venue.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Camp MusArt Music Lead will serve as the principal music instructor and music director for LAMusArt's 2026 Summer Production of Annie Jr. The Music Lead will work in collaborations with our Drama Director, Dance Lead, and Visual Arts Lead to produce the full production of the selected musical. The Music Lead will be responsible in leading four (4) classes per day (one hour and fifteen minutes each) introducing students to varying concepts in music, music appreciation and technique while simultaneously teaching all the music needed for the show.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Foster a safe, inclusive, and engaging learning environment where all students feel valued and motivated to succeed. Catered to the student's skill level and age group. Encourage creative expression, teamwork, and problem-solving through exercises and activities.
- Develop, coordinate, and execute curriculum in music that introduces students ages 7 to 16 to musical concepts, sight-reading, music history and all of Annie Jr. repertoire.
- Supervise student during class times, rehearsals, half of the student's lunch break and at the off-site venue culminating performance.
- Maintain communication with Camp Coordinator & Programs Manger regarding student progress and/or behavior issues.
- Collaborate with other faculty and staff plan and organize rehearsals, performances, and special events, as needed.



QUALIFICATIONS & SKILLS DESIRED

- Bachelor's degree in a music field (such as performance or education) from an accredited college or university (enrolled or graduated)
- Experience developing curriculum and working or supervising K-12 age students.
- Familiarity with music direction, choral music and musical storytelling.
- Knowledge of California Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) standards.
- Good organizational and time management skills and the ability to balance multiple tasks and responsibilities.
- Ability to work collaboratively as part of a team.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- Conversational level in Spanish preferred but not required
- Possession of a valid California driver's license, personal vehicle, and valid insurance.
- Schedule flexibility for the last week of Camp MusArt leading up to the performance, July 20th - July 25th
